## After Easter: The Great Permission

Many of us carry around a few "back pocket" Bible verses. That is, we have at least a few verse of Scripture memorized so we can call on God's Word when we need to hear a word of comfort, encouragement, or promises. John 3:16, Philippians 4:13, and Psalm 23 are great examples of this.

My guess is that many of us have Matthew 28:19-20 tucked away in our memories even if we don't know the reference. Jesus said to the disciples, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

This passage is known as "The Great Commission," the point at which the risen Jesus gives the charge and calling to his disciples to spread the resurrection news in word and deed. This commissioning is not limited to that group gathered around Jesus' presence on that day in Galilee. These words are addressed to all people who gather around Jesus' presence in any space and time, including you and me!

Within Jesus' words of the Great Commission comes something that simply cannot be overstated: **permission**. Jesus tells his followers that they have been enabled by God to go out and love and

serve the world. He does not establish a system or a hierarchy, he simply says, "Go!"

Bob Sitze offers these words of encouragement: "The biggest 'permission'? You get to stand alongside all the rest of us – we're called 'the church' – and work with other asset-gifted people to do together what you could never accomplish alone. In the church, you get supported and loved and encouraged. You are forgiven. You learn to forgive..." When we receive God's permission, we are empowered to move forward in faith!

Now, here's a challenge: What would our life as a congregation be like without the word "need"? Try catching yourself when you start saying, "Someone needs to..." or "You need to..." Don't just use a synonym; saying "Someone has to..." is cheating! Yes, this proves to be a difficult exercise, but how might we envision congregational and community life without that word? I suggest we might start seeing more and more of God's abundance.

This is the dynamic Luther Snow describes in his book, *The Power of Asset Mapping*, when he compares the "Negative Cycle of Recruitment" with the "Positive Cycle of Affinity."

This is how he defines the Negative Cycle of Recruitment – and see if any of this continued on page 2

sounds familiar: "There is a task in the congregation that people think is difficult or distasteful, so not many people volunteer to serve on that committee, and all of the work falls on a few shoulders. As a result, the task seems more difficult, people drop off the committee, and the work falls on fewer shoulders, and the cycle continues."

This cycle is perpetuated by needs-based thinking and it is a tiring endeavor. Perhaps the question that is rightly asked at this point would be: If nobody wants to do this, should we keep doing it? It's important to ask that question because there is another way!

It's the Positive Cycle of Affinity: "Two people in the congregation discover that they share a common interest of affinity in some activity. They decide to combine their talents to work together on that activity. Other people see that these two people are having fun, so they want to get involved, too, and they see ways to contribute their own talents. With more people involved, the activity becomes more successful, which creates new possibilities for more people to contribute, and the cycle continues."

In the permission of God's grace, we can see how energy and enthusiasm increase and multiply in the Positive Cycle of Affinity. In many ways, it is the "So What?" of Easter. Jesus rose, so what? Well, we are saved and called – commissioned – to live out our faith as God has gifted us so we can have a positive effect on the world around us.

So that's why we go, why we move forward in faith: because we have a great God who

has provided abundantly for us, who has given each one of us incredible gifts and abilities, who gives us permission to use those gifts, and who promises to be with us every step of the way! •

# Congregation President Jerry Jensen

Carole and I recently returned from a one week vacation in Arizona where we visited Sedona, Phoenix and Tucson. It had rained a couple inches two weeks previously and much of the dessert was in beautiful spring bloom. We enjoyed a week of perfect temperature, blue skies, scenic views and fragrant flowers.

Although the desert is beautiful there are a variety of prickly cacti and slippery shale rocks which can make for prickly painful encounters as well as falls and scrapes. There are also populations of scorpions, snakes, lizards, fire ants, coyotes and havalinas which are large hairy wild pigs with a reportedly mean disposition. We personally encountered all of these yet they did not detract from our vacation experience.

In the Genesis creation narrative it states after each of God's creations, "And God saw that it was good". One could view each of these desert creations as pleasant or unpleasant. The alternate route worked beautifully and we were able to reach Phoenix and return to MN without a problem.

We would like to put our Christian life on cruise control however we have to adapt our route due to dust storms, road condition changes, weather changes, accidents, detours, mechanical problems and other unexpected happenings. Over the years we at St. Philip's have likewise adapted our ministry to our changing environment.
