Faithful to God's Will

It is fairly common for us to talk about and invoke God's will in the life of St. Philip's. Most obviously, we pray every week in the Lord's Prayer, "Your will be done, on earth as in heaven." We even acknowledge that God's will is more important than our wills when, for example, the Board of Administration prays at the beginning of each meeting, "Almighty God, draw our hearts to you, guide our minds, fill our imaginations, control our wills, so that we may be wholly yours."

Seeking God's will and praying that it will be done are commendable, even necessary, parts of being a follower of Jesus. Discerning God's will is just as commendable, but it is quite difficult. I often wonder what God's will is for St. Philip's and what it looks like for us to be faithful to God's will in and among this faith community.

I've heard a lot about many people's wills for St. Philip's and I can (and do) certainly share my own, but I've been involved in many fewer conversations about discerning God's will for St. Philip's. I offer this as an observation, not a criticism. I think it's quite understandable that we are far more comfortable expressing our own desires and wills than discerning God's will. God's will may be hidden

or obscured at times. It's much more time-consuming to have deep conversations about divine intentions than it is to share our own opinions and act on them. Discerning God's will is pretty inefficient and very involved, as it turns out.



Of course, we can toss off some general attributes of what we think God's will is: love your neighbors, feed the hungry, do unto others as you would have them do unto you, and so forth. All of these ideas are good and they are all biblical.

But how are we to discern more specifically what God's will is for this congregation? I have a lot of questions surrounding God's will for St. Philip's: Is it God's will that bigger equals better? How does God desire us to engage and be in a relationship with the neighborhood and community around the church building? What is God's will for the faithful use of our congregation's finances in what we give away, what we spend on ourselves, and how we

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fund ministry opportunities? What if God's will is for St. Philip's to be what it is today?

I have plenty more questions and I know that you do, too.

So we return to the question of discerning God's will. We all certainly have opinions about all these questions, but those opinions do not necessarily represent the will of God; the very will we pray be done each time we pray the Lord's Prayer.

So we can either find a different prayer or we can work together to discern God's will. I'd discourage the former and encourage the latter!

One invaluable, and potentially overlooked, resource we have in this discernment process is the wellspring of wisdom we know as the Bible. While the Bible is not

an answer book, it is, in the words of Martin Luther, the "cradle that brings us Jesus of Nazareth."

That is why, beginning in September, we will be taking an intentional journey through the entire Bible - a journey we're calling "*The Story*." During this biblical deep dive, we'll get to know God better through God's story and we'll be better equipped to locate ourselves within God's story. That connection will then allow us to better discern, understand, and faithfully live out God's will for St. Philip's, for our lives, and for the world.

While I'm not sure just where this journey will take us, I am fully confident that we will experience joy, hope, and life in new, profound, and meaningful ways. And we can keep praying, "Your will be done, on earth as in heaven."

The excitement, planning, and anticipation of a new school and program year is so real at St. Philip's, too! The Holy Spirit has been working through countless meetings, conversation, and visioning regarding much of our youth ministry for this coming year. But, before we get to that – on behalf of the youth ministry of St. Philip's, I'd like to extend a warm and exuberant welcome to Pastor Mollie!! Pastor Mollie and I have had the chance to connect over the summer to start plans for a new year of Confirmation. It is so evident from my interactions with Pastor Mollie that she is indeed called to this community and in this time for a great purpose. We are so grateful that you are here, Mollie!

Now, for even more excitement, we have a new year of Confirmation and High School Ministry on our horizon! Are you ready?! It's hard to believe that summer is more than one half over. People in Minnesota look so forward to summer and all the outdoor activities; one of the reasons we live here. But along with summer comes the bad weather too. I am sure many members of St. Philip's received hail damage from the June 29 storm, to both their homes and cars. One thing we usually don't think about is the damage that might have occurred at St. Philip's. In talking to Katie, there was significant damage to the roof/shags over the Chapel. There were also a number of the outdoor light fixtures that were damaged as well as sky lights. There was damage to gutters, downspouts, and some of the AC Covers. There will be more details later in August. We can only hope that we are adequately reimbursed. We all know that you never make money on property damage, with luck you replace or upgrade the damaged items. With a church like St. Philip's, there is also a large deductible to be met; one area we do not budget for. We only can pray for the best.

Another key area that is progressing very well is the Columbarium Project. The Columbarium Committee consists of Joan Kruse, Neal Anderson, Harold Kurtz, Lynette Thompson, Margo Tech, Ed Hamernik and Bob Becker. For

those members that may not know what a Columbarium is, it is a dedicated facility of the church containing niches for the inurnment of cremated remains of a deceased human. It is the 21st Century version of the small church with a cemetery adjacent. The plan is to have a Columbarium outside Fellowship Hall facing Moore Lake, built along side the building. It will contain multiple niches that members may purchase. There will also be a beautiful landscaped area outside the niches and into the Serenity Garden.

This committee has been working very diligently in researching the legal and technical issues, visiting other churches with Columbariums, and preparing governing rules, a configuration of the niches, a landscaping plan, and a business plan. The committee met with the board on July 14. At that time they presented the master plan, answered questions the board had, and was seeking approval to proceed. The board unanimously voted to approve the plan. A couple from our congregation has offered to loan the Columbarium Project Seed Money so that it can proceed. This is a very generous opportunity. The members of St. Philip's are very lucky to have such dedicated members. The operation and all costs will be handled through the sale of the niches.

This is not a budgeted item for the church and does not burden the church financially. A perpetual fund will establish an endowment to sustain the Columbarium for future years. It will operate similar to the Endowment Fund.

The members of St. Philip's will receive detailed information regarding the plan and how members may proceed with the next steps. It will also be available on the church web site, www.splcmn.org This is a very personal decision and will require thoughtful decisions by our members. It may not be the right solution for everyone. Many people already have funeral plans and inurnment locations picked. However, based on the attendance at the three sessions on funeral planning and feedback from attendees, there is a lot of interest and members are seriously thinking about this stage of their life. I personally feel that this is an excellent solution to many of the concerns and wishes of members of St. Philip's for final inurnment.
