Generosity Continues to help Nigeria

Members of St Philip's contributed \$2,500. to the Lutheran Church of Christ of Nigeria (LCCN) to assist in caring for refugees. This was given in response to an appeal from the Minneapolis Area Synod which designated the Synod Assembly offering in May for this purpose. The Assembly offering for LCCN, which is the Minneapolis Area Synod's companion synod, amounted to \$13,000.

Thanks to members of St Philip's for this generous gift, part of which came from previously undesignated mission and benevolence funds. The larger part of St Philip's contribution was given by members in response to a notice in the weeks preceding the Assembly.

Through these gifts we are helping the Nigerian Church provide for people who have fled from their homes as a result of terrorist attacks of Boko Haram. For several years this terrorist groups has killed and kidnapped children, youth and adults, also burning churches and homes. To save their lives thousands of people have fled to the city of Yola and the area where LCCN has its seminary and church offices. Thankfully we have reports that recently many have been able to return to their villages and homes.

On behalf of our Nigerian brothers and sisters, thanks to members of St Philip's for your generosity. Let us continue in prayer for the release of the kidnapped and for peace in Nigeria.

St. Philip's Disaster Relief

The dates have been chosen for the fall Disaster Relief trip although the destination has not been determined. The current plans are to leave St. Philip's on Saturday, September 26 and return Sunday, October 4. With thousands of homes damaged due to flash flooding in Texas and Oklahoma in May, those are two likely destinations. SPDR coordinators have contacted Upbring Disaster Response – the Lutheran Social Services affiliate helping families and communities in the aftermath of natural disasters in Texas, Oklahoma, and Louisiana. Also, \$1000 has been sent by SPDR to the ELCA's Lutheran Disaster Response for the recovery efforts following this flooding.
