They did a great job planning, organizing, managing and making sure we did not have any

rain. It is a great congregational project where you meet and get to know other members of St. Philip's. The money will go to many worthy projects within the church.

The end of summer transition also brings a staff transition. St. Philip's has said farewell to Interim Pastor Tim Savarese and Carly Tappe who served as Children and Family Ministry. We are sorry to see them move on. They did a great job while they were here!

We also have welcomed Associate Pastor Mollie Dvorak. Pastor Mollie started on August 1, and has already presided over some of the services. It is great to see the energy and excitement that she brings to St. Philip's. She is definitely a great addition to our staff!

The St. Philip's Columbarium project is moving along. Presentations have been given at the Sunday Services and a display has been set up in the Office, showing the physical plan including landscaping. Members of the committee are available to answer any questions you might have. Please feel free to contact anyone on the committee if you have any questions or concerns. A number of people have already signed up for a niche. Take a look at the display in the office and pick up a packet.

Building For The Future

September marks the one-year anniversary for the Building for the Future appeal. The goal of the appeal is to raise \$200,000 to ensure that our church remains in good condition for the future. The response from the congregation has been fantastic and, as a result, it has been a very busy year! Through July 2015, contributions to the appeal total \$153,093. Of this amount, \$14,551 has been set aside for benevolence concerns and \$23,266 has been used to build a reserve for future unplanned property and grounds needs. The remaining \$115,277 is to be used to address the current needs of the church building and grounds. The total spent through July is \$102,999.

The needs addressed so far include the following:

- Roof Repair Replaced the roof above the nursery and the north side of Fellowship Hall
- Cupola Repair Repaired the loose boards and replaced the lights for the cross
- Sunday School Rooms Replaced the worn carpeting in rooms #17 and #18 with tile
- Door Opener Installed an automatic door opener for entrance #2
- Narthex Windows Replaced the cracked window panes
- Courtyard Windows Replaced the stained windows by entrance #2
- Office Carpeting Replaced the carpeting in the main office and all staff offices
- Sound System Replaced the sanctuary sound system with a new state-of-the-art system
- Parking Lots Patched cracks, sealed and restriped all the parking lots

The projects included on our original list that are awaiting funding include the following:

- Sanctuary Windows Reseal the stained glass windows to preserve them for the future
- Exterior Lighting Replace the fixtures and bulbs on the post lights to improve the lighting of the grounds, to reduce operating cost and to improve the appearance of the lights
- Landscaping Develop and implement a landscape plan for the church grounds, improving the appearance of the church from Highway 65 and Moore Lake Drive. Install a sprinkler system to ensure the landscaping stays healthy during the summer months.
- Weir Replacement Use natural plantings to clean parking lot runoff water before entering Moore Lake

In addition, new needs have been identified over the past year. While the repairs to the roof above the nursery have been completed, other areas of the roof now need repair! Also, the air conditioning units in the office are getting old and are failing, and replacement units are no longer being manufactured. An updated approach for heating and cooling this area would improve efficiency and lower our utility costs.

As you can see, there continues to be the need to raise funds to properly maintain our beautiful church. Additional contributions can be included in the Sunday offering by indicating "BFTF" on your envelope by the Special box or brought directly to the office. MN Landscape Arboretum & Lunch

Thursday, October 8 from 9:00 am -3:00 pm

Aaaah....Autumn in Minnesota! If you are a nature explorer, outdoor enthusiast, a garden lover or just want to enjoy the fall colors this outing is for you. Come spend the day at the MN Landscape Arboretum, ranked by Explore Minnesota as a top visitor attraction. Meet in the church parking lot on Thursday, rain or shine. Dress casual and wear comfortable walking shoes. Anyone 55+ is welcome to attend.

Shortly upon arrival, we begin by riding the Arboretum Trumpet Creeper, an open air tram, for a narrated one hour tour of the 1,100+ acres of gardens and woodlands. Following the tram tour, we'll go to the Visitor Center for lunch in one of the many gathering rooms where we will find our box lunch consisting of a sandwich, chips, cookie, and soda. After lunch, start your self-walking tour; discover the many outdoor gardens, view the exhibits, visit the gift shop or just sit on one of the many garden benches and enjoy nature.
