Easter - year round by Pastor Mollie Dvorak

Many people are used to the idea of Lenten practices—giving up coffee or chocolate, perhaps, or doing some kind of regular spiritual discipline during the weeks before Easter. But why does that stop at Easter? What if those practices became habits; Easter practices that happen all year long? What would Easter practices look like?



Barbara Brown Taylor, an Episcopal preacher, wrote in *The Preaching Life* about what it was like, as a little girl, to learn ballet. She remembered all the time she

had to spend practicing. She stretched and sweated over positions until her bones ached and her muscles "yelled out loud." Then one day she got to put all this practicing together. She bent and rose and swept through the air like someone to whom gravity no longer applied. She got to dance. Remembering this, was a way that helped Taylor in her faith. As in ballet, she says, so it is with our faith: we have to learn the basic positions. Each requires us to practice. Each teaches us a way to move, so that when God invites us to put them all together, we may jump with joy to join the dance. Luke says: If you're going to dance, you're going to have to practice. Faith is not just something you have; it's something you do.

Acts 2 guides us into the habits all Christians need to practice. These are "Easter practices."

Practice Being Together: First, practice "meeting together" (Acts 2:46)—practice "the fellowship" when you worship together (v. 42), and also practice fellowship in each other's homes (v. 46). "Together" is a key word in this passage. Be together.

Practice Learning: Second, practice learning. Those first Christians "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching" (v. 42). Learning isn't just an activity you do to achieve something, it is an activity itself you should do well. Learning together is not meant to just fill your head, it is meant to shape your life.

Practice Praying: Third, practice praying (v. 42). We talk about prayer being a conversation with God; much like a conversation with a trusted friend, only it's a HOLY conversation. Good words for us all. And remember to be specific in prayer, like when you say "forgive me my sins" name some; or "take care of these people and situations" and name some; and remember to tell God "you are great" and name some of God's great ways. And as we practice prayer we find we are dancing in the faith.

These practices might seem like they are only for Easter, but since we live in the promise of Easter every day, they serve as encouragement for all Christians, in every season. My hope is for us all to take these "practices" and make them our habits, so that we can find the joy of Easter in our every day, all year long.

SPDR Weekend Update

St. Philip's Disaster Relief commemorated ten years of rebuilding homes and lives through several activities on February 20 and 21. Team members were involved in the worship services as ushers, lectors, assisting minister, and communion servers. Pastor Ken Nelson, SPDR team member and senior pastor at First Lutheran Church in Minot, ND, spoke at all three worship services and at the dinner expressing gratitude

to the Disaster Relief supporters and team members for all the hope and help given to the flood victims of Minot.

Over 450 bids were made on the 182 donated auction items that were available for bidding after worship services and at the dinner. Many generous winning bids make it possible for the journey to continue.

(A note about the auction items: Thank you to everyone that donated or bid on an auction item. All auction item winners have been notified. Auction items donated or won will not show up on St. Philip's members' giving statements.)

As dinner guests arrived, they were able to browse through the display of photos, publications, mementos, thank you's, plaques, and other items the Disaster Relief has collected over the past ten years. The journeys have created many wonderful moments and memories.

On Sunday evening, 300 guests were served dinner by Disaster Relief team members that had spent many hours on Saturday preparing for the dinner. Their efforts were rewarded with almost \$1300 in tips! Thank you to all that attended the dinner and for the generous tips that make it possible for the journey to continue.

That's how much the annual cash flow for our ministry will increase when we pay off our mortgage.

Here is the strategy:

If we pay our monthly mortgage payments of \$6,907 each month and a group of people in the congregation are willing to step up and contribute an additional amount of \$10,000 each month, then our mortgage will be paid by the end of 2016. To date, we have commitments for nine months or \$90,000.

We are opening this to the congregation to fund the final three months. One person may take a month or it could be a combination of members.

(I like winter as much as the next person, but for those of you who are actually sad to see winter end, I know a good therapist.




