


others. The season of Lent is a time to be transformed as we prepare for Holy week.

St. Philip's Disaster Relief Dinner & Auction

Special guest at the Adult Forum and the dinner on February 21 will be Pastor Ken Nelson from First Lutheran Church in Minot, ND. (First Lutheran housed the Disaster Relief team members on seven of the trips to Minot.)

The Nelson home was severely flooded in 2011 and the basement of First Lutheran was damaged by the flood. Also, Pastor Ken was a member of one of the St. Philip's Disaster Relief teams in 2013 in Minot. Be sure to attend the Forum and the dinner to hear his experiences.

As in the past, there will also be a sealed bid auction that will included many themed baskets, tools, household items, gift certificates, electronics, and much more. Auction items will be available for bidding after worship on February 20 and 21 and also at the dinner. This year, 50% of the auction proceeds (up to \$2,500) will be earmarked to go towards the proposed new storage facility at St. Philip's that would house the Disaster Relief trailers upon its completion.

Your support through the purchase of dinner tickets and bidding high on auction items ensures that the journey continues for SPDR in 2016.

These leaders specializing in the medical care, rehabilitation, and conservation of eagles, hawks, owls, and falcons.

Property & Grounds Update

In addition to the never-ending, day-to-day needs of our church, the Property & Grounds Committee will focus on three significant initiatives during 2016:

Building for the Future: The program to restore our building and grounds by addressing longignored needs will continue in 2016. Hopefully you have noticed the many improvements that have been made during the first year of this program! There are many additional projects on the drawing board, such as maintaining the stained glass windows in the sanctuary, replacing the antiquated fire alarm system throughout the building, beautifying the church grounds with new landscaping, etc.


Storage Facility: On the south side of the church, near the community garden and the entrance to the boiler room, there currently stands a garage, shed and an enclosed area for one garbage dumpster. The garage and shed are used to store both tools and equipment to maintain the church property, as well as items that are used infrequently in the church. This entire area is very unattractive when you look at it from the site of the new columbarium or from Highway 65. In addition, there are several needs that are not being addressed by these structures: (1) The storage capacity of these buildings is inadequate for the growing needs of the church, and (2) space is not available to house the St. Philip's Disaster Relief (SPDR) trailers and tools. Currently the SPDR trailers are stored at a private residence and one received considerable damage during the June hailstorm.

The solution that is being considered is to replace the current garage and shed with one, significantly larger, building. This new building would have three stalls, one of which would be used by the SPDR ministry. The exterior of the building will be designed to match the appearance of the Fellowship Hall, giving it a look of belonging with the main church building. In addition, an enclosed area would be constructed of sufficient size to hold both a garbage and a recycling dumpster.

Fellowship Hall: When the Great Hall was added to the church it was designed to be both a gym and a fellowship hall. As our congregation has aged and other facilities have become available in the community, the space is no longer used as a gym. Therefore it has been suggested that we look at ways to make it more useful for large gatherings, such as dinners, presentations, worship services, etc. To develop ideas and to prioritize needs, a task force has been organized and has begun meeting.
