## Daily Devotion *by Pastor Mollie Dvorak*

As summer starts to sneak around the corner, our life styles tend to shift a bit. Whether it be the demand of outdoor activities, travel, or more time for leisure, the pending summer months change our daily schedules and life is getting busier and busier. But, that does not mean our faith life has to take a back seat to all the fun that will be going on this summer. I thought I would share a daily devotion format I use that is easy to follow and can be done anywhere!

***Pause, listen, think, pray, and go!***



**Pause** - Find time to slow down in your day- busyness has taken over, so take a breath, sit down, relax your body.

**Listen** - To scripture being read, to a hymn or song, to someone you invited to join you in this devotion and ask them, "Where have you seen God today?"

**Think** - About what you just heard? Study a word or phrase in the reading you read or song you heard, conversation you had- think about how God is working through you today

**Pray** - be in conversation with God- give thanks, lift up names of those you worry and wonder about, ask God to continue to guide you in your day, read a prayer.

**Go** - Be sent out into the rest of your day, filled, renewed, knowing Christ is with you!

This format comes from the daily devotional site: D365.org. It is a quick and easy daily devotion that you can find online through their website or you can download the app on your smart phone. Each of these 5 steps invites you into a deeper meditation on scripture, and a deeper relationship with God. I have been using the app for about a month. I noticed that I look forward to taking that 5 or 10 min break in my day to be with God. Having it on my phone makes it even more convenient since my phone is always with me. Whether you use the app, website, or follow the 5 steps and create your own each day, I encourage you to take some time to see what these 5 steps do for you.

## St. Philip's Disaster Relief - Colorado Trip



33 SPDR team members, from five different states, spent the first week in May helping those in the canyons and flatlands of Colorado that had experienced fires and floods that damaged or destroyed their homes up to 5 1/2 years ago. While staying at Heart of Longmont Methodist Church, team members worked at homes in Fourmile Canyon near Boulder, Estes Park, Loveland, Longmont, and Rist Canyon near Bellvue.

The work was as varied as the terrain with teams installing tongue and groove boards on floors and ceilings; installing nine new doors, frames, stops and hardware; repairing a deck and replacing damaged siding; sheetrocking, taping, mudding, and sanding in a garage; building carports; installing wiring and staining and sealing doors, door frames, and window frames; and preparing meals for the team members.

Some of the homeowners have been trying to rebuild their homes on their own and all were so grateful for the help received. One homeowner wrote on Facebook, "We cannot thank this team enough for all your hard work and friendship! The 'leg up' has been a real boost- both toward progress on the house, and to our spirits! Thank you again! This time next year, when you visit (which you must!) you'll see this home being lived in!"

Another wrote, in part, in an email to one of the crew leaders, "Friday my mother called me in despair on news that her closest brother was given notice that his cancer metastasized and his son indicated hospice is imminent. Your pictures enabled us to enjoy, together, the fruition of a project that he has been wanting to see since we started. He will not be able to physically get there. I believe you are an angel, both mine and his. I don't know how to thank you and the crew for what you have done for my Uncle Curt. I suspect he will tell you personally someday. It is so very comforting to know love is not bound by physical limitations. I know I will see you again, here or there, hopefully both. It makes my heart so much lighter than circumstances do. Give my love to everyone and thank them for me. You guys are the grace of God."

A major SPDR milestone was achieved on this trip. Early Tuesday morning, the work of the 33 Colorado team members surpassed over 25,000 hours of working to rebuild the homes and lives of those that have been through a disaster. This is a remarkable achievement that speaks to the passion and compassion of all those that have been involved (in so many ways) with SPDR. We are so thankful for the blessings that have been bestowed on us during the past ten years. The journey continues...

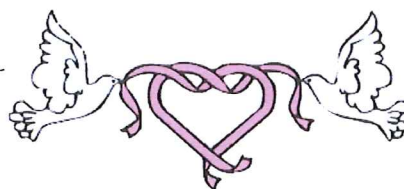

## President's Column *Mike Youngberg*

So I just returned from the Disaster Relief trip to Colorado. Two things kept throwing themselves across my path as I journeyed on this trip. The first has two parts, both about community. 1) We build our community here in order that we have the strength and courage to go to those in need. 2) In the going, our community is strengthened even more. When we work side by side with someone else for days at a time, share meals, prayers, and long car rides, we reveal ourselves in deeper ways than when we see each other in church on Sunday or at a weeknight meeting. Those working beside us become real human beings. But most of all, they are faithful servants of God, doing God's work. Things that might be major stumbling blocks in another place become less important somehow. The work that binds and unites us is far more important than what might divide us.

The second thing is about the people we help. We are pointed in the direction of someone who needs help, and we try to give it. We don't ask whether they deserve it or not. That's not our job. Our job is to give help where help is needed. Occasionally on these trips, we ask ourselves whether the ones we're working for deserve our help. Jesus never said anything about deserving. He simply said serve those who are in need of our help. It is about needing, not deserving. We are not wise enough to know all the possible reasons why someone may need help. It is enough that they do and that we respond.

Perhaps we all need to focus more on what connects us in mission and less on what causes us irritation every day. It is, after all, the work that matters. You don't have to be on a mission trip to be human or serve. Find a way to know those working beside you better. Take the time to listen and hear their stories. It is our humanity that makes us alike and our mission that connects us. And serve without bothering yourself about whether someone deserves it or not. Everyone deserves our help, and Lord knows there are enough of "The least of these" everywhere.

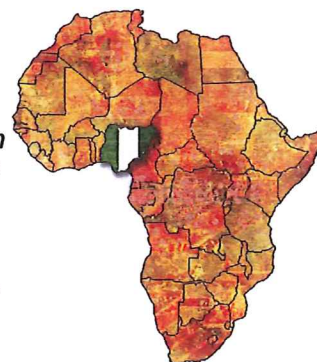
*Dear Friends,*
