"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him, endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God." -Hebrews 12:1-2

And what we taste and receive here now is but a foretaste of that great banquet that awaits all the sinner/saints 'who run with perseverance the race that is set before them.'

# Faith, Sexism, Justice; A Conversation about Faith and God

You are invited to take part in a significant conversation in the life of St. Philip's and in the life of our denomination, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). "Faith, Sexism, Justice" is a seven-session conversation about important topics in the life of the church. Through your participation, you will be able to provide feedback and insight into the ELCA's work in developing a social statement from the ELCA Task Force on Women and Justice.

Each session will include Bible study, prayer, and conversation through a lens of justice surrounding issues of sexism in the church. The study resources state, "Many individuals and their families struggle emotionally, physically, and economically because of the effects of sexism and patriarchy. These forces are personal, religious, social, and economic. As members of the body of Christ that is the church, we are called to help all people live abundant lives that are just and sufficient - lives in which every individual and community is committed to the mutual values of respect, dignity, interdependence, and equity."

The topics and the schedule are as follows:

November 6: Why do we need to talk together?

November 13: What problems do women face, and what does justice require?

November 20: How is sexism personal, and how are we the body of Christ together?

February 5: What does economic sexism look like, and how can we seek equity for all?

February 12: How can we address violence against women and girls?

February 19: Why do words and images for God matter?

February 26: How do we challenge the misuse of Scripture against women and girls?

Each session will meet on Sunday evenings at 6:00 pm in the Lounge.

# St. Philip's Disaster Relief Eureka, MO Trip

A team of 14 men and 11 women spent the first week in October in the Eureka, MO area doing flood rebuilding work. Heavy rainfall from December 26 through December 28, 2015 led to flash flooding and historic river flooding along the Meramec River with thousands of businesses and homes damaged or destroyed at an estimated cost of over one billion dollars.

The SPDR team was part of a 100-day blitz to get 20 families back in their homes before winter. The team members worked in seven different homes - sheetrocking, taping and mudding, removing and replacing sub-floor, repairing plumbing, installing a door, wiring a home and installing many recessed lights, connecting electrical service, insulating, installing paneling, building a 75' long handicap ramp, and many other tasks.

The team's devotions were centered on tools. Each evening, the group leading devotions chose a tool and reflected on how we and our work are like the tool and what the tool does. We were all part of God's toolbox - used to help those in the Eureka area rebuild their homes and lives.

# Letter from Nigeria, from the Sekenwas

Excerpts from correspondence from Dr. Sekenwa Briska and his family, Yola, Nigeria, former members of St. Philip's, September 29, 2016

"Namsy is back to school and doing fine. The rest of the kids - Martin is back to school in Dashen; Sikama has just completed his registration, this weekend he goes back to school; Namkama resumes on October 8th 2016....

"In August, precisely August 16 - 17, 2016, I had an episode of getting dehydrated over night when I went to University of Jos for moderation of our students' exams scripts. I had four black outs or collapsed four times in my guest room and at the hospital. I was taken to Bingham University Teaching Hospital Jos and was on drip for 48 hours. That was the only medication I received, they had several tests but found nothing. I was discharged after two days. My wife [Nuwayina] had to come down to Jos and we spent 8 days before going to Yola. We thank God for everything. I thought it was time to go. It was all about stress and might have eaten something and had a food poison or so. God is in charge of our lives. Glory be to him. I am very well and healthy going on with my work as expected. Please greet all our friends family. We read about many who have gone to be with the Lord. Our condolences to all of you. We pray for their families and the entire community."

#### Pie Night


