A Letter From The Sacks ELCA Missionaries in Japan

November 1, 2017

Dear Friends in Christ:

We are always thankful for your support of us as missionaries through the ELCA. We appreciate your ongoing prayers and financial support on our behalf.

Here's a message to say to you: as a missionary "overseas" I can see that you also, equally, are missionaries " over time." We are called, some of us through location, some of us through the passing of years.

That is to say, I have recently been struck with the importance of Sunday School.

When we are teaching little ones or young people, we trust that seeds are indeed being planted, but oftentimes we may not "see" the plant that has emerged, nor realize how deeply those roots have extended into the fertile ground.

A patient that I met recently at the hospice where I serve taught me this lesson. I will call this woman

Suzuki san. She was in her 80's, and she was close to the end of her life.

I was asked to offer pastoral harp ("prayerful present through voice and hard") at Suzuki san's bedside. When I started to play, Suzuki san listened pensively to the Gregorian chant and Taise musical prayers. Very soon into the music some tears ran down her cheeks. When I brought the music to a close after 30 minutes or so, Suzuki san immediately began opening up to me. She said that, as a child, eight decades ago, she had regularly gone to Sunday School in a neighborhood church, and, listening to the music, somehow she felt as though she was right back there in her Sunday School. Mind you, I had not said a word about the meaning of the unfamiliar music sung in Latin, nor the fact that I was a missionary or even Christian, so I was so surprised to hear the music had connected her with that particular memory.

Then, it was quite endearing, as she continued to evangelize me, in essence. She explained that in Japan, there are "The gods" (and she put the palms of her hands together as one would when bowing before a Buddhist family altar) and then there is also KI-RI-SU-TO SAMA (the term for Lord Christ - then she made the sign of the cross.) She was taught in Sunday that KI-RI-SU-TO- SAMA is always watching over her, protecting her. She mentioned that her mother, being Japanese, took care of the family Buddhist altar, but she and her mother also loved KI-RI-SU-TO SAMA ~ so they were very busy!

She had forgotten these memories of Sunday School for many decades, but the music brought it all back to her in an instant. This lovely woman made her Great Travel to Heaven just three weeks after that. I'm so grateful that I could meet her at that precious time, and again twice after that.

The hospice director told me that in her eternal resting

form in her casket, there was a cross bookmark lying upon on her shoulder. We do not know who put it there. Yesterday I happened to share this story at a church where I was asked to preach. I received the most wonderful present at the Congregational fellowship after the service. One man in his late thirties told me he had heard me play "Jesus Loves Me" at another program three months ago, and hearing that, he recalled his Sunday School days, and decided to return to church after many years of being a prodigal child. And he will be baptized at Christmas!

So, dear brothers and sisters, remember your calling of being the missionary "over time". We just never can predict nor imagine how, or when, or why those seeds will take root. It may be tomorrow, it may be in the late thirties, or it may be at the time of someone's eternal journey.
