A Message from Pastor Christine Wenzel

With the landscape of American churches quickly changing, we can safely say that all churches are in transition. Congregations everywhere are seeking to make sense of, and negotiate the new realities. Churches that are able to move beyond maintaining the institution as their primary mission have the best shot of recovering their purpose and passion for ministry.

As an intentional interim pastor, one of my first tasks is to listen and learn. Thank you to the many members

and friends of the congregation who came in to share hopes and frustrations during this transition time. Some of you are long time members, and others, newer members. If I were to categorize the stories I heard, they would fall under the following:

The leaders and heroes that are remembered – Which pastors, members, teachers, friends, etc. who were significant in the life of the congregation.

"Days of Glory" recalled – Back in the day, when the membership was so large you needed to build a new sanctuary. And the large number of children and youth you had compared to today.

Remembrances of crisis and turmoil experienced, both personal and communal – A loss of trust in pastors, either because they were asked to leave, or needed to resign. Closing of the Saturday night worship. A change in staffing. Too many committee vacancies means a change of governance, including updating the constitution (which the ELCA requires every 2 years)

The hopes and dreams that have accumulated over the years – Resulting in an inclusive welcome. An understanding that the future of the church lies in our neighborhoods, not in our buildings.

"For freedom, Christ has set us free." Galatians 5:1a

On the Fourth of July, we celebrate our national freedom, but Jesus calls us to celebrate our Christian freedom each and every day. What are we free to do? We are free to love unconditionally -- to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

We have recently trained "Friendly Visitors" to reach out to our members who may be homebound or in a care facility. These visitors will bring Holy Communion to members, pray with them and share scripture and most importantly, simply visit with them. As we expand our Visitation Ministry it might be helpful to understand how we go about visiting those who wish to be visited.

- 1. If you or a loved one would like a visit, please call the church office and leave a message for Pastor Margie. I will return your call as soon as possible.
- 2. If you know of someone that you think might enjoy a visit ASK THEM if they would like a visit. Explain that we now have a Visitation Pastor and several members who are willing to visit other members.
- 3. If they would like a visit ask them if they would like to contact the church themselves or if they would like you to make the contact. The contact should be direct and personal, not second-hand information.
- 4. If they say "no" to a visit at this time, let them know they are always welcome to contact the church at a later date.
- 5. Understand that not everyone wants or needs a visit and respect each person's wishes and privacy.

This month I want to do a shout out to several groups of people who help keep St. Philip's" outreach ministries going. The first is Benevolence and Social Concerns which is responsible for most of the local projects which reach out into the community. Projects like the Sheridan Project, Thanksgiving baskets, all those Christmas trees with the little tags, and our own church food shelf make a huge difference in Fridley and the surrounding area. The second is Global Missions. They are responsible for the projects that reach out to the international community like Global Health Ministries in Fridley. They also coordinate our support of missionaries Jim and Carol Sack and our support of Billie congregation, our sister congregation in Nigeria. The third is SPDR (St. Philip's Disaster Relief) which does exactly what its title suggests, traveling to places that are rebuilding from natural disasters. This ministry has reached out across the country from Colorado to Texas to New Jersey to Missouri for the past twelve years. Not to be forgotten are lesser known groups like the Quilters group and the Knitters group which provide quilts, afghans, shawls, hats, and mittens to groups or individuals in need.

The members and non-members who are directly a part of these ministries are important, and so are you; the rest of the congregation, who by your financial support, encouraging words, and prayers support them. All of these ministries have been going on for years, and that is a testament to the people of St. Philip's and their caring and dedication.

But there is more. Now I would like to plug two new ministries which we hope will reach out to our local community. 1) The hope is that the Wednesday night suppers, which are happening once a month during the summer and will pick up every week in the fall, can become a meal not just for those who are at St. Philip's for a specific event but will be open to and draw members of the local community. Help is always welcome in preparing and serving. Contact Renee Youngberg 2) The St. Philip's Advocacy group had its first meeting on June 20. The group will support and advocate for the rights and concerns of our poor neighbors and those who are part of LGBTQ, Muslim, Asian, African-American, Latino, and Native-American communities in the area. Kingdom Assignment Report

As citizens of the world, we try to stay tuned into the needs of others. The enormity of the Syrian refugee situation really continues to grab our attention. Carry for the Future began by supplying baby and child carriers to refugee parents. We were able to send our lightly used baby carrier to them some time ago. Carry for the Future began a new initiative to provide baby boxes for families when they had collected more than enough carriers. The "baby box" is a literal box parents can use to keep their sleeping child safe and includes essential supplies to support a newborn. Having just been through the baby years, we cannot imagine what it must be like to not only give birth to a child in a tent but also maintain their safety and health with a few supplies. The box, supplies, and shipping cost exactly \$100. This was a very fulfilling opportunity to be able to support a family.

We wanted to include the kids in the Kingdom Assignment, so we invited the Pritchards over so we could create 50 peace cards for **Carry the Future**. Knowing refugees come from various backgrounds, we consulted with our neighbor whose husband immigrated from Turkey. She let us know that a dove with an olive branch would likely be a sign of peace for many.

Family News from Japan

Notes from Jim & Carol Sack, St. Philip's missionaries in Japan

As a family, we continue to do very well and are kept quite busy with the many opportunities we have been given to train, teach and offer witness to the living Christ here in Japan.

Carol is currently working with the sixth set of students taking the Lyra Precaria course, where they learn to use the harp and voice at the bedside of the dying, there have been 32 graduates from the first five classes that have completed this two-year study. Most of them are active in providing care to those who are dying and their families in various hospices and hospitals throughout Japan.

For this academic year, Jim was asked to be head of the Christianity department which means he has a number of new committee meetings to attend to each week but provides him with numerous opportunities to deal with students in the department. He continues his teaching at the graduate school in clinical psychology as well as teaching pastoral counseling in the seminary. Jim also trains staff at a large Lutheran nursing home to do active listening with the patients who live in the facility.

We are also fortunate to have two of our three grown children coming back and living in Tokyo. This provides many chances to be with our two granddaughters since they live just a 10-minute ride from our home. We hope to have the chance for all of us to reunite again when we return to the States. Each occasion to be together is a cause for thanksgiving!

Jim and Carol Sack, St. Philip's missionaries in Japan, ask us to pray for:

- 1) Four seminary graduates who became pastors in March as they begin their ministry for the Lord
- 2) Mr. Chisaka, an adult male student who proclaimed his faith and was baptized at Christmastime.
- 3) The rapidly aging society of Japan and the decrease in population of younger people.

- 5) The seminary as it struggles to deal with the loss of important faculty members through retirement.
- 6) For Jim and Carol, that they will be empowered by the Holy Spirit to be clear witnesses for Christ in their assignments.



St. Philip's Disaster Relief: May Trips

In last month's issue of *The Friend*, St. Philip's President, Mike Youngberg, wrote about the need to dedicate ourselves to service as a sacrament and bring that sacrament to as many in our community and world who need it. Many St. Philip's Disaster Relief team members did just that in May.

A team of 24 spent May 7 - 13 serving those in Eureka, MO. This was the second trip to Eureka and the plan was to help with the rebuilding after the record-breaking Meramec River flooding that occurred in December of 2015. Those plans changed when the Meramec flooded again on May 3, 2017, breaking the 2015 record.

A few team members did some rebuilding – insulating and skirting a trailer home and redoing the bathroom in a second trailer home – both in Arnold, MO. The majority of the team spent the week moving personal belongings, mucking, and/or gutting in ten homes – most in the Eureka area. It was tough to see the destruction in so many homes that had just recently recovered from the 2015 flood. Thank you to the 24 team members for their service on this trip.

Because of the need of so many in this area, a third trip to Eureka is planned for October 1 - 7. Consider dedicating yourself to service as a sacrament and be part of the team helping those in need in Missouri. Watch the St. Philip's publications for more information.

Three days after the team returned from Eureka, a tornado caused severe damage to a large area centered around Chetek, WI. The following Saturday, three SPDR team members traveled to the area and spent a few hours removing downed pine trees and limbs from the yards of two homes on Prairie Lake. On Sunday, a second team of three was back in Chetek again removing downed trees and limbs from two homes on the opposite side of the lake. The following Wednesday two team members returned and removed more limbs. On Thursday, three more team members spent the day loading tree limbs on a trailer and hauling them to the brush site. The landscape of this area has been changed forever and the homeowners there will be dealing with the effects of the tornado for a long time.

As always, we are so thankful for the SPDR supporters. The journey continues because of you.
