Did you Know?

Property and Grounds Committee

The church facilities are playing an important part in our church mission and over the years the congregation has seen fit to expand the facilities to an impressive building. As stewards of this facility, it is the primary focus of the Property and Grounds Committee and the many volunteers.

It is obvious that we have a large facility and that it has many aging components. Because of the Building for the Future program that was initiated a few years ago, we gathered the resources required to make some significant high cost but very necessary repairs and upgrades to our facility.

A review of major repairs last year indicates that we spent over \$8,000 on parts. Because of the exceptional volunteers in our congregation we saved \$14,000 in labor costs. Some examples of the purchase/repair cost and the labor cost savings done by the congregational volunteers are as follows:

These numbers do not reflect the value of the extra cleaning and more routine maintenance activities done by our Women on Wednesday and Wednesday Men's Work Crew.

In the months ahead, we will continue to update you on completed projects at St. Philip's. We will also keep you informed of needed projects, such as replacing the outdated office air-conditioning with a cost of \$35,000.

Jim and Carol Sack Tokyo, Japan

Dear Churches in Ministry with Us:

We want to briefly share some good news that comes out of the Japan Lutheran Theological seminary. On Sunday, February 25, we had our annual, "Seminary Evening" where each graduate gives a short sermon and we celebrate that event with them. Next Sunday, three new pastors will be born at their ordination ceremony.

The ordination ceremony is a little different from those in the States. All of the new pastors are ordained together at the same time. The president of the national church, the bishops from each district and a representative from the foreign churches working in Japan will lay hands on the candidates for this service. I am honored to be able to represent the missionaries this year. April 1 is the starting date of the new work year here in Japan. That means these three pastors' very first act will be to preside and preach at the Easter services in their new congregations where they do not yet know the members.

We covet for your prayers to bless each new pastor and his ministry. We ask God to not only bless the pastors, but each member of the congregations they are being sent to serve. As we have shared before, the Lutheran Church in Japan is finding itself to be older and somewhat smaller than in recent years. Therefore, we pray to God that each pastor would be anointed with God's energy and wisdom to have a fruitful ministry in their new assignment.

The following graduates will be ordained next week:

Mr. Satoshi Morita. He comes from a non-Christian home and has a younger brother. His family, especially his father, was against his becoming a pastor. He had been working in a company for some years before answering the call to go to the seminary. He will be assigned to Shinreizan Church, which also has a small farm where delicious milk and ice cream are produced. There is also a social welfare institution on the property that ministers to the elderly and children that have trouble going to school.

Mr. Kazune Noguchi. He is a wonderful musician who plays the violin. Not only is he graduating and being ordained, but he is also getting married on March 17 to a graduate of our college. Therefore, he is having a great deal of change take place in his life at this time. He will be assigned to a two-point parish a couple of miles north of Tokyo. The two churches are Nagano Church and Mastsumoto Church. He will go to serve there with his wife, Minami.

Mr. Satoshi Tada. He has a background in philosophy and languages and also comes from a non-Christian family. This past year he served as an assistant to the school pastor and was responsible for helping to organize the religious programs here for the chapel. He is being assigned to Hiyoshi Church in Tokyo, where the sanctuary was rebuilt a year ago. This church is hoping that the new pastor will make good use of his gift of relating well to young people. We give praise to God who has inspired and called these servants into God's ministry of Word and Sacrament.

The Benevolence Committee

The Benevolence Committee will once again be assembling newborn kits as a Global Missions project. Items should be dropped off at the table provided near the Narthex by Sunday, April 22, as we will be assembling them on that day.

Items needed are: regular bath towels, washcloths, Ivory soap (wrapped), cotton newborn or 3 month undershirts (not onesies), cloth diapers, diaper pins, infant stocking hats, receiving blankets (30x30 size), two gallon Ziploc bags or cash.
