## Fall Trip - Hurricane Harvey Rebuilding St. Philip's Disaster Relief Team

The journey continues for St. Philip's Disaster Relief (SPDR) with a second trip to Texas to help with the rebuilding efforts from the flooding one year ago following Hurricane Harvey. This will be the SPDR's 26<sup>th</sup> weeklong trip helping those that have been impacted by disasters.

The team will leave St. Philip's on Saturday, September 22 and arrive in Galveston, TX on Sunday evening. They will work five days under the direction of the Galveston County Long Term Recovery Group and will stay at the Zion Retreat Center. The team will depart from Galveston on Saturday, September 29 and arrive back at St. Philip's on September 30. (They shouldn't be delayed because of snow this time.)

# News from Companion Congregation in Bille, Nigeria Mr. Clement Dah

Dear Jim Hougen and Members of St. Philips Lutheran Church. Greetings to you all in Jesus name.

It has been quite some time I was not able to communicate with you. I am very sorry please. Thank you for your email plus Easter greeting card received in May, 2018. I am very sorry again for not able to reply you.

Thanks to God for giving me privilege to update you with happenings in LCCN Bille. First and foremost; the Bille community is living in peace despite constant wanton killings of other tribes in Adamawa and other parts in Nigeria by the Fulani nomads. We continue to pray to God for His people in Nigeria to see peace prevails.

**Transfers:** The former pastor of LCCN Bille, Rev. Japhet Manu, has been transferred from Bille to take charge of another division. He was replaced by Rev Arnold Umaru, who is also a Bille indigene.

**Replacement:** Evangelist Pius Kasuwa who has been in Dakka, Tiba hills and Wasi village areas for Evangelical works since 2007 has been called back home in February, 2018. Evangelist Amos Antibas has replaced him in March, 2018.

#### **Brief Biography of Cathechist Amos Antibas:**

He completed primary school plus junior secondary Married with 7 children Ordained as Cathechist in 2014 Held over a congregation in a village Speaks Wakka his dialect, Hausa, English and Fulani


## Thank You
