<sup>17</sup> And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Col. 3:17

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ Jesus,

Grace, love, and peace be to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Spring is coming, the seasons are changing, and we want to think of green grass and flowers. Spring is a time for new things; it is a time for change. We make fun of our resistance to change in the Lutheran church, but if truth be told we get behind change quite a lot. Think of all the technological changes and societal changes we have embraced. I think we worry about change because sometimes change is done too slowly, sometimes too quickly, and sometimes in a confusing manner. We all know that some things do change, but we just want the change to be done well.

To that end, I am inviting the congregation to read a book called, "Who Moved My Pulpit"? by Thom Rainer. Essentially, it is a manual on how congregations can affect change well. It talks about the problems and challenges to overcome. It also gives us a roadmap to work out change in our congregation. I'm asking that groups, teams, circles, and individuals read and discuss the book this Easter season. I don't agree with everything in the book, but it is the best resource I have found on congregational change. I'll be preaching a three - part sermon series on change in our congregation after Easter. The book is available for everyone in the office. There is a suggested donation of \$5, but it is free to all who need.

Later in the spring and throughout the summer, I'll be conducting a congregation wide visitation at homes, church, coffee shops, and listening posts that members host. I'm looking forward to hearing what you think and feel about the book and about change in our congregation.

We, in this part of the world don't often have sunny bright Easters warm enough to melt the ears off a chocolate rabbit. No. More often than not our kids are trudging through leftover snow and a little mud with their Easter baskets flying in the wind.

But the promise of resurrection is there. Blades of wheat may not be poking through the dark earth, but if we look closely we'll see some rhubarb and maybe a jonguil or a crocus. And when we do, we catch our breath.

Love has come again like wheat arising green.

My call as your Visitation Pastor is bittersweet. I see people begin to fade and know their time to go home to Jesus may be near. It always seems to surprise me. I want to ask, "so soon?" But I know that as their Redeemer lives they shall live also and will rise with healing on their wings. This is the resurrection promise of Easter. Thanks be to God.
