## Growth, Stability, Youth, Outreach, and Openness Matt Flom, Pastor


For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many. Mark 10:45

## Hurricane Harvey Trip #4 St. Philip's Disaster Relief Team



Hurricane Harvey hit the Houston, TX area over two years ago. Some families are living in their unfinished homes and others are living elsewhere because their homes are still uninhabitable. This is what the SPDR team who traveled to Texas found in the Needham Road community north of Houston.

The neighborhood on River Oaks Drive is in a low - lying area that frequently floods. The residents are mostly of Hispanic descent living in manufactured homes or slab homes that have been added onto (often more than once) over the years. The rain from Hurricane Harvey and the floodwaters from the San Jacinto river caused major damage in these homes.

Working through the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, the 28 SPDR team members spent the week working in five homes. Most of the work consisted of flooring installation, electrical work, installing side, soffit, and fascia, plumbing, tiling, interior and exterior painting, and installation of appliances. Some of the team members spent two afternoons prepping food at The Abundant Harvest Kitchen – an organization that provides food distribution and community meals in the area. Also, two members spent the week planning, preparing, and serving meals for the rest of the group.

One of the homes the SPDR worked in towards the end of the week was still far from being ready for the family (the mother and eight children) to move back in. Realizing the great need of this family, the day after the team returned home, a small group held a conference call with our partners in the Episcopal Diocese and the outcome was a return trip to try to get this family back in their home before Christmas. A small SPDR team will return to Houston November 9 -17, as the journey continues with Hurricane Harvey Trip #5.

Thank you to the team members of Hurricane Harvey Trip #4, our supporters, and our partners in Texas.



On behalf of my family, I would like to thank everyone for your continued prayers for my sisters Pat, Carol, and Annette. Carol is no longer with us, but all of your support and love has helped me as I continue to treasure all our memories.
