I have read many WW2 novels and I always wonder at the way people survived. Life as the people of Europe knew it was stripped away from them, but when the war ended the church bells pealed, the altars were filled with flowers and life began again.

We will survive as well by the gracious goodness of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We are the body of Christ no matter the distance we are apart.

Parable of the Spoon

Behind the second door, the room appeared exactly the same. There was the large round table with the large pot of wonderful stew that made the man's mouth water. The people had the same long-handled spoons, but they were well nourished and plump, laughing and talking.

The man said, "I don't understand."

God smiled. "It is simple," He said, "Love only requires one skill. These people learned early to feed one another. Those who are hungry are greedy people, and they think only of themselves."

I stumbled upon this parable one day, and it struck me as a unique way to visualize love. We hear all the time, love your neighbor as yourself, but how often do we love our neighbor before ourselves?

During this time of turmoil that we know as COVID-19, I have had the privilege to witness many choose to love their neighbor before themselves. People grocery shopping for those who cannot leave their home. A group of people gathering meals for children who would have otherwise gone without when their schools closed. How to Access Worship Services

We will be utilizing Facebook Live as one of the means to connect with our congregation and community during the Covid-19 outbreak. Because the St. Philip's Facebook page is public, you do not need to have a Facebook account to visit it.

On our church's website [www.splcmn.org] there is a Facebook logo button below our calendar. Click on the logo and it will lead you directly to our Facebook page [https://www.facebook.com/splcmn/]. It will ask you to login or create an account, click 'not now' if you do not want to proceed with this step as it isn't necessary, just simply keep scrolling to view the desired content.

We will begin our live stream at the regular times of worship, including Wednesday Lent Worship at 6:30 pm, Sunday traditional worship at 9:00 am, and contemporary worship at 10:30 am. Scheduled worship times for Holy Week and Easter will also be streamed if the ban is still in place. Tuesdays Together will be cast on Tuesdays at 1:00 pm, Evening Prayer Group at 6:30 pm on Tuesdays, and Adult Catechism at 4:00 pm on Wednesdays.

If you miss the Livestream, visit our website to watch the recorded version. Click on the first drop down 'About St. Philip's' and then 'sermons.'
