I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. Isaiah 43:19

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ Jesus,

Grace, love, and peace be to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It's a new year and a time of new beginnings. I would like to invite you to try something new, but first let me give you an example.

This fall we brought back the requirement for our confirmation youth to complete worship notes and service hours. Our youth are so insightful that reading their worship notes is one of the highlights of my week. By seeing what they understand and don't; I can become a better preacher. We asked our students to do their service hours here at church. Volunteer to help with an area you have never done or haven't done in a long while. I promise you won't have to do it longer than you want to. See and experience your church from a new perspective, meet some new people, and have the joy of helping others get to know God better.



Morton, MN Rebuild Trip

A late November request from Lutheran Social Services of Minnesota resulted in a two-day rebuilding trip to Morton, MN in early December. We were asked to help a young family recover from flooding after heavy rains and a blocked culvert in July resulted in over two feet of water in the home they had purchased only 60 hours prior. The family of five could no longer afford rent for an apartment and the home mortgage, so they had moved back into their unfinished home six days before the SPDR team arrived.

Nine team members worked on Friday installing drywall; taping, mudding, and sanding; and installing doors and jambs. On Saturday, seven team members completed the drywall installation and the door and jambs installation. They also started the laminate flooring installation and working until 6:00 pm, were able to complete the dining room, kitchen, bathroom, and two entryways. Thank you to Mike Carroll, Matt Johnson, Renee Johnson, Dave Landrus, Dick Lekang, Spence Minear, Greg Rosholt, Tim Solberg, Mark Swenson, Jordan Young, and Richard Young for sharing your time and skills to help this family. There is still much work to be done. A trip next month for another SPDR team is a possibility.

Hurricane Harvey Update

With over 750 hours of labor by SPDR in October and November and through the continued efforts of volunteers and the staff of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, the Olvera home was completed, enabling the family to move back in prior to Christmas as planned. A heartfelt thank you to all that made that possible.
