- Sunday, July 12 was approved as the reopening date for onsite Sanctuary worship services with the exception of a renter to meet as a small group in Fellowship Hall beginning June 14
- Passed resolution of confidence in Property & Grounds Committee to move forward with spending of their budgeted monies for safety and other projects as deemed appropriate
- Worship attendance, giving, and ministries continue to be strong; a letter from Pastor Matt and President LaRae
 Kazmierkoski will outline current state and goals for the future
- Racial Reconcilliation: Pastor Matt is planning a prayer service in unity with the churches that worship at St. Philip's
