



6 As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, 7 rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

6-7 My counsel for you is simple and straightforward: Just go ahead with what you've been given. You received Christ Jesus, the Master; now live him. You're deeply rooted in him. You're well constructed upon him. You know your way around the faith. Now do what you've been taught. School's out; quit studying the subject and start living it! And let your living spill over into thanksgiving.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace, love, and peace be to you from God, our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This March we start our Lenten journey for 2022. Pr. Eric and I are preaching a series on Wednesday evenings about several of the people St. Paul meets in the Book of Acts. Paul journeyed quite extensively throughout the eastern Mediterranean and met many people. This Lent we will go on a spiritual journey and meet several of them. On March 9, we will meet Lydia and talk about the importance of leadership in the church. On March 16, we will meet Silas and learn about courageous faith. On March 23, we will meet the couple Priscilla and Aquila and talk about teamwork in service. On March 30, we will meet Timothy and learn about having an identity as a servant of the Lord. Finally on April 6, we will meet Barnabas and learn about encouragement in faith. There are many different people and many different lessons on faith and life.

We will have a change this year for Lent. The Wednesday night service will start at 7:00 pm and go until about 7:45 pm. The Curbside Community Supper will still start at 5:30 pm. Between 6:00 and 7:00pm will be time for Christian Discipleship (children, youth, and small groups). I invite you to come and join us for a spiritual journey this Lent. Who will you meet this Lent or how will God meet you?



Journeys of Life Eric Nelson, Associate Pastor

"I want Jesus to walk with me; I want Jesus to walk with me; all along my pilgrim journey, Lord, I want Jesus to walk with me."

I Want Jesus to Walk with Me (ELW 325)

The journey of life brings us through many events we have little preparation for and likely do not anticipate. There are, of course, many expected occurrences in life as well, but the trickiest ones to handle are usually those unplanned difficulties in the journey. When those times come, it is so important to know the presence of God, but this is best known in our practice as disciples.

Throughout the season of Lent there is the common custom of some sort of fasting: giving up chocolate or some other simple pleasure, not eating meat on Fridays, giving up social media, or any other number of ways individuals might enter a type of fasting. This is commonly done as a sacrifice and self-discipline as we remember and live into Christ's time of fasting and temptation in the wilderness. But sometimes the fasting becomes disconnected from the purpose behind it. Though self-improvement is a wonderful goal, that isn't the aim of this fasting. Though there may be some suffering in giving up a simple pleasure, this doesn't truly relate us to the suffering Christ endures for our sake.

The point is to take a time of re-centering our lives and our trust in God. Giving something up makes time to take something else in. We can take in a time of silence, prayer, and devotion. We can take in an intentional time with another person. We can give something up to be more present to God's presence with us in so many ways. We can remove and examine barriers we may make in our daily lives and habits so that we can be more connected to God and the people God puts in our lives. We can grow in our practice walking as disciples throughout our different journeys and callings in life.

We do not know exactly what each season of life will bring us, but we can work to stay centered in where God connects to us, seeking to walk with Jesus, mindful of God's presence alongside us instead of distracted in our daily grind.

Whatever your practice in Lent, to give something up or to add in devotional time and prayer, seek to know God's presence each day. Seek to hear God's voice on the journey, to seek God's way on the journey, and to handle the expected and unexpected of life with faith in the Lord as we grow as disciples on the journey.

God bless you in this season and may Christ always be with you in the journeys of life.

Invite Jesus on Your Journey Margie Guelker, Visitation Pastor

"By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust and unto dust you shall return." Genesis 3:19

Adam and Eve have just been expelled from the Garden of Eden and God is telling them how it will be with them and with all of humankind for ever after.

We begin Lent with the words: "you are dust and unto dust you shall return" sounding ominously in our ears. These words are a "wake up" call for us. They call us to a season and a life of repentance. None will escape this fate. None of us will live forever except in the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

I can remember as a child receiving the imposition of ashes on my forehead. The gritty ashes scratched a little and sometimes they fell onto my eye lashes. I knew Lent had begun with its disciplines of prayer and fasting. 40 days lay before us even as promises of spring and resurrection began to make their appearance.

As a pastor I counted the preparation of the ashes to be a sacred duty. Toward the end of my ministry the priests from next door shared ashes with us. In a way it bound us together in this holy ritual. These ashes were created from burning the palms from Palm Sunday the year before. They were dried through the year and then burned and crushed and sifted. But nothing could get rid of the gritty feeling of the ashes, nor should it.

On Ash Wednesday, people would line up to receive the ashes. I can see them still. Some held their hair back, some put out their hands, some had to bend way over so I could reach them. And then there were the parents bringing their babies forward. That always gave me pause. Weren't they too young to be reminded of their impending death? But the parents knew. We all knew what our end was to be and we submitted to the words and the ashes.

When the service was over and the candles extinguished, I looked at my fingers. Black with a blackness that was not easily washed away. And so Lent began . . .

Hold these days gingerly in whatever disciplines you choose. Invite Jesus on your journey. Soon the stone will be rolled away.
