We kick off fall programming around St. Philip's with great anticipation. We look forward to gathering as the church together even as we continue to navigate life in an ever-changing world.

So much has changed and shifted over the past few years. We've had times forced to be physically apart and great changes to our daily lives and calendars. I won't be foolish enough to forecast what the coming year looks like, but I will be bold enough to invite us all to start filling our calendars thoughtfully this fall.

A colleague in ministry once pointed out that our checkbooks and calendars speak volumes about our life of faith. She named these as holy documents. This is beautifully stated. Both show how we spend our assets, how we spend our money and our time. We'll take up discussion of the checkbook another time. This fall, I will focus on the calendar.

Fill up your Sundays. Make gathering in your faith community a priority. Make plans on your calendar to gather with others as you're able. Let your calendar tell a story that moves past the best new series we've seen on any given streaming service. Let your calendar be a picture of your life lived in faith. Your calendar and patterns will look different from your faithful neighbor's calendar, but both will tell stories of how you are uniquely living the life God has given you.

I will also throw in this caveat. None of us should just start saying 'yes' to fill up our calendars. We say 'no' to some things so we can say 'yes' to others. This way we can live into the community living in faith spoken of in the hymn "All Who Are Hungry, Gather Gladly."

We can exit our restless lives that seem non-stop by creating meaningful times and spaces, creating things we say 'yes' to with purpose. We can hold onto safety, staying apart and/or masked when unwell. We can make meaningful statements in the use of our time that show how we intend to serve God and neighbor in the world.

Make your unique holy calendar document. We hope to see you at SPLC and out in your community! God bless our schedule making! God bless the unexpected changes to our schedules as well. Let each day be a day with God, lived with purpose and intentionality.


Rally Sunday - Congregational Brunch

St. Philip's Kindergarten Program Heritage Group



The new church organized in early 1958 was growing rapidly with families – families with children. The Fridley School District did not, at that time, offer a kindergarten program. At the May 19, 1958, meeting of the Board of Administration (BOA), the Education Committee was approved to investigate the possibility of providing a kindergarten program beginning the fall of 1958.

From The Evangel on June 23, 1958: The plan would be to hold two sessions of kindergarten each day, Monday through Friday, beginning when public school opens in the fall.

From The Evangel on August 5, 1958: The curriculum will be that of a Christian Lutheran school, teaching the normal skills taught in a public kindergarten. This includes Bible stories and Christian song.

By August of 1958 a teacher had been employed – Mrs. Ronald Prazak (Marian) – to teach morning kindergarten. Class size was limited to 30, and the class was full! Tuition was \$12/month for members and \$15 for non-members. If enough additional applications were received, another teacher would be hired for an afternoon session. On May 28, 1959, commencement was held for the first class to graduate from the St. Philip's Kindergarten Program. Diplomas were presented by Mr. Gerhardt Lohmann, Chair of the Education Committee.

The BOA at its December 15, 1958, meeting approved the continuation of the kindergarten program for a second year, beginning in September of 1959. The response to the weekday Kindergarten Program was remarkable. 65 applications had been received by early August and they continued to arrive. Mrs. Orien Vick (Carol) was employed to teach the morning session, replacing Marian Prazak. Mrs. Roy Reierson (Estelle) was hired to teach the afternoon session. If enough applications were received, a third session would be added, to begin as soon as the education wing was completed.

Even though Fridley Schools would be providing kindergarten in the fall of 1960, the BOA approved the continuation of the Kindergarten Program for its third and final year from 1960-1961. Education was and continues to be important at St. Philip's. It wasn't long before the Education Committee was working on a new educational opportunity – Nursery School. This would become a very successful program that continued for many years.

Fall Trip St. Philip's Disaster Relief



St. Philip's Disaster Relief (SPDR) is headed back to Waverly, TN with a team of volunteers to help rebuild homes that were damaged by flash flooding in August 2021. Waverly is a community of 4,000 residents in Humphreys County where nearly 1 in 15 homes were damaged and 20 lives were lost.

The team will leave Saturday, October 1, work five days in Waverly, and return on Sunday, October 9. Registration, via email, for this trip will be September 10 - 18. The Journey Continues

Storage Facility Construction

Demolition and construction of the new storage facility will commence after the completion of the garage sale. To date, the old garage sale shed, and the dumpster enclosure have been taken apart. The boards from these structures will be recycled for shelving in the new facility. Beginning the week of August 21, the old garage will be emptied, and the items will be put into an onsite storage container. During the week of August 29, the old garage will be demolished, including the floors and curbs, and leveling (grading) of the site, and new footings will be poured. The construction of the garage itself will start on Monday, September 19.
