PRAYER

Seeds of Faith Eric Nelson, Associate Pastor

"The one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." - 2 Corinthians 9:6

October fully settles us into the season of fall. As farmers and gardeners take in physical harvests of food, we certainly ought to consider how this is shared in our communities so that all can be fed. But I also consider the words of Paul in his writings to the Corinthians. He speaks of simple truths of the harvest. One who doesn't plant much won't gather much. One who plants a lot will gather in a lot.

Obviously, we know that there are questions of weather and other variables that can impact the crop. One might not receive quite as bountiful a harvest as they anticipate, but they plant as if it will produce! I was recently speaking with an individual who shared about encouraging a loved one time after time, year after year to get back to church. They said their words finally did something. After years, their loved one was back. One might not con sider that a bountiful harvest. That is just one person showing back up to church. But think of how often this was done in care.

That is the other thing we can do in our frequent planting of seeds in the faith. When done with care, knowing the person you are speaking to and already being in relationship, one can further the hope for growth. When even a stranger is genuinely treated with respect and care, there is a possible place for a seed of faith to grow. As we first show care to someone, there are beginnings of good soil for the seed's growth found in the care of our God.

Jesus reached out to meet people's needs of healing, hunger, and forgiveness which helped bring them closer and often to become his followers. We don't receive detailed stories about any who might not have followed after being fed or healed, but Jesus doesn't seem to be keeping score of this. Jesus simply goes out fulfilling the needs of others and sharing the nature of who God is. The harvest is plentiful.

Sometimes we Christians lean hard on one aspect or another. Some are great at showing care and kindness. Some are great at boldly telling of faith in Christ. We should genuinely lean into both as we plant in the harvest. We can ask ourselves where we are being called to grow in this. Can we grow in genuine care for others? Can we grow in boldness sharing faith? What is our first step in any of this today?

Wherever we are, we remember that God works. Even if uncaring, God can grow faith from that seed like a plant in the crack of a rock. Even if timid to share, God can grow faith from our love. Still, we long to grow in this, sharing news that is too good to keep to ourselves and giving thanks that we are invited to experience God's love and grace and share it in the world.

Let us participate in planting and harvest and give thanks!

Hmong Artwork in Room 1 Heritage Group



In April of this year, the Heritage Committee reached out to the congregation with a "History Mystery".

Two pieces of Hmong artwork had been found and we were looking for information on who donated the item, where they came from, and how they had been displayed in the past.

We have learned that both pieces were purchased and gifted to the church by two members of the congregation. We thank them for their generosity! Over the next few months and with the assistance of the Quilters and the Property & Grounds Committee, these two pieces will be displayed in Room 1 for all to enjoy.

Already on display in Room 1 is another piece of artwork. It is a Hmong Story Cloth. The Heritage Group reached out to Pastor Bee Vang, pastor at Amazing Grace Lutheran Church, for help in understanding the story.

Pastor Vang explained that this type of artwork is called "Paj Ntaub". He explained that it does not tell a single story, but rather it depicts several ways of life/stories within its framework. After studying the piece, he explained that it tells the story of the creation in Genesis through the gospels.

Pastor Vang's explanation will be included in the November 2022 edition of the Friend.




SPDR - Ready to Roll Books


