## Mountaintop Experiences Eric Nelson, Associate Pastor

"How good, Lord, to be here! Yet we may not remain;
But since you bid us leave the mount, come with us to the plain."
How Good, Lord, to Be Here! ELW 315

We continue to celebrate God coming into the world with us as Jesus Christ. We move from who God is shown to be in Jesus' humble birth into who God is shown to be in Jesus' ministry on earth in the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is a joyful revealing of who God is and how God is a light to all the world. Readings in Epiphany span from Jesus' baptism to Jesus' transfiguration on the mountain top.

In Jesus' baptism and the mountaintop transfiguration, a voice comes from heaven saying the same words, "This is my son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:17, 17:5) In Matthew 17, the voice from heaven also says, "Listen to him!"

While the disciples want to remain on the mountaintop in Matthew 17 where they have seen the glory of the Lord, Jesus leads them back down the mountain.

So often, we would wish to remain in the highest points, reveling in the glory and splendor of God. There is a place for that, but Christ shows that it is not where we are to always dwell in this life.

Christ leads his followers back down the mountain and out into the world. Upon return, Jesus is back to ministering to those in difficult places as he cures a boy with a demon.

Jesus reminds us that the revelation of who God is and what God can do is meant to be carried out into the world. We are to show up alongside each other when troubled in sin, sickness, pain, and whatever else comes our way to show and speak of the healing love of Christ.

The Holy Spirit sends us to carry the light of Christ out into the world. I pray Christ is continually revealed to you. I pray you have your own mountaintop experiences, seeing the glory of God. And I pray we will all courageously be sent out to share the joy and healing of our Lord in the world each day.

I usually enter the New Year with trepidation as well as anticipation. I've been around long enough to know that wonderful things and terrible things will come my way. And you just never know when ...

2022 was difficult for me in many ways, but it was also a time to reflect on the ways God was with me in those difficult times. Without a calm and quiet soul, there were many times that I could have flown apart. What is the secret? It is to look for the good in all things. Where was I being held in the love of God? Who stepped in to take care of me when I needed taking care of? Where did I find unseen resources?

I will just mention three of those times. The first was the death of my father of 98 years. It was truly a long Minnesota goodbye - two funerals - one on the west coast and one here. It took a lot of coordination and not a little travel. The church where we held the Minnesota funeral was a blessing to us as well as the funeral home who worked with us. My father was finally home with my mother at Fort Snelling National Cemetery. It was blessing upon blessing as people gave us what we needed. Even the funeral luncheon was perfect!

The second was coming down with Covid two days after I returned from the trip to the Passion Play in Oberammergau, Germany. My doc said I needed to be quarantined for ten days. I live alone so this wasn't going to be easy. But my brother called, and he and his wife dropped off sacks of groceries for me, twice! Neighbors dealt with yard work, mail, etc. and a friend dropped off my medication and I was more than fine and grateful for all that people did for me.

The third thing happened just before Thanksgiving when my garage door opener broke, and emergency service was not an option. A neighbor came and opened my door so I could drive my car out and park it in the driveway. I live in a wonderful neighborhood, so I called my neighbors to tell them why my car was outside. The neighbor across the street said he had a new garage door opener he'd never used, and would I like him to come and install it for me? And so, he did. When I asked him what he wanted for it, he said, "Merry Christmas." It was a most welcome blessing.

You see, Jesus is everywhere watching over us and caring for us in unexplained and inexplicable ways. Jesus knows that terrible and wonderful things will happen in 2023, and Jesus is getting ready to take care of us. We simply need to see the blessing and be grateful and pay it forward. An attitude of gratitude is no small thing. It is a gift from God.

The donation of a scanner from Renee Johnson's nephew, Jason Waldron, owner of a Cartridge World in Maple Grove was very much appreciated. The scanner and an old laptop from the church office have made the scanning process much easier.

## Trip and Updates St. Philip's Disaster Relief Ministry



A SPDR Team will be traveling to Waverly, TN for the third time in a year. The trip will take place during the last week in April or the first week in May of 2023. In August of 2021, the area received 20 inches of rain in a 24-hour period causing severe flooding, throughout the community, resulting in 20 deaths. The SPDR team will assist in the rebuilding efforts in Waverly and the surrounding area. Once again, the team will stay at the Waverly United Methodist Church.

Over the past six months and continuing into 2023, many hours of the team members' time has been spent on the planning, construction, organization, and physical move into the SPDR "stall" of the new St. Philip's Storage Facility.
