This resulted in a substantial drop in offerings. Many folks contacted us and we sent them substitute envelopes. Also, many people realized that they had gotten behind on what they wanted to give and caught back up in giving. This has been a huge help to the church. We have also come to realize that quite a few members find it best to worship at home/online. We can see that most Sundays there are between 60 and 80 views of Sunday worship, but we of course don't know who is watching (and nobody knows how many people equal a view). We are seeking to put together a roster of online/at home worshiping members so that we can serve them better. If you and your household participate in worship online/at home, please let me know. Pr. Eric and I would like to be able to visit you and make sure we stay connected. You are always an important part of the St. Philip's family of faith.

I also want to thank all the leaders and volunteers who are working through all these issues and are continuing to make St. Philip's a better place. St. Philip's continues to make a tangible difference in the lives of our members and members of our community. Thank you for your dedication and faithfulness.

The Voice of Jesus Margie Guelker, Visitation Pastor

It was dark that first Easter morning when Mary went to the tomb. She was filled with grief and had not likely slept much since Jesus was crucified. Her weeping made it difficult to see clearly. She went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been rolled away and when she looked inside, she saw two angels sitting where Jesus had lain. She told them she was looking for Jesus and they told her that he had risen from the dead. Mary turned and walked away from the tomb and when she did she saw someone. She thought it was the gardener, but then he spoke. Jesus spoke her name, "Mary," and told her to go tell the disciples that he had risen. Baldawhat?? Heritage Group



Next time you are in the Sanctuary, look up! That unique, massive canopy hanging over the altar is called a Baldachin. What is a Baldachin? It is a ceremonial canopy of stone, metal or fabric over an altar, throne, or doorway.

St. Philip's Baldachin, created in the form of a cross, is suspended 22 feet above the altar.

At the very center, enclosed in a bursting sun, is the Chi Rho (first two letters of the Greek word for Christ), and the Alpha and Omega, (first and last letters of the Greek alphabet). This symbolizes Christ as the beginning and the end.

The Holy Spirit, represented by a Dove, is placed over the sun.

A six-pointed star under the sun symbolizes the six days of creation when God created this earth and all living creatures.


On the left side of the cross, the wafers and chalice indicate that we receive God's grace through the body and blood of Christ in Holy Communion. Five wafers are used to symbolize the five wounds inflicted on the body of Christ, and the wafers are round to symbolize the eternal life we receive through God's grace in the Lord's Supper.


On the right side of the cross are five loaves and two fish, based on the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand, reminding us that our daily bread and all that we need to live on this earth is given us by God. The loaves are rectangular to symbolize the material world.

The Baldachin was designed and created by Professor Palmer Eide of the Augustana College Art Department. He was assisted by his son, Peter Eide and Steven Larson, a graduate art student at Augustana.

Designs were cut into eight-inch-thick chunks of Styrofoam which were then mounted on a lightweight base sheet and covered with plaster saturated burlap. The fine coating of sand applied to the plaster gives a rough textured appearance. Created in 32 sections, the 56x32 foot canopy was shipped to Fridley and joined together on a suspended metal frame. The joints were sealed with the same burlap-plaster-sand procedure.

The new Sanctuary, including the Baldachin, was dedicated on November 27, 1966.





Waverly Trip & Storage Facility St. Philip's Disaster Relief Ministry



A SPDR Team will be traveling to Waverly, TN for the third time. The trip will take place in the last week of April. In August of 2021, the area received 20 inches of rain in a 24-hour period causing severe flooding throughout the community. The SPDR team will assist in the rebuilding efforts in Waverly and the surrounding area.

Registration for the trip will run from Saturday, April 1 - Saturday, April 8. Registration will be processed through email. If you wish to receive the registration information (and don't currently receive SPDR email messages) please send an email to [spdr@splcmn.org] requesting the registration info. We invite you to join the team. All are welcome. And very importantly, no building skills are required.

During the trip those at home can follow the team's activities on Facebook through the St. Philip's Disaster Relief page. As during past trips, we are planning to make at least one post per day recapping the day's activities, but there are usually many posts each day by team members.

We continue to prepare and move our equipment and supplies into the SPDR stall of the new Storage Facility. Our larger trailer was moved into its new home in January and the second trailer joined mid -March following a major backyard snow dig out. Again, thank you for everyone's help in making this project happen.


