
# Meals on Wheels

# SPDR Trips & News St. Philip's Disaster Relief



#### SPDR Fall Trip

The 2023 SPDR Fall trip is scheduled for Saturday, September 30 - Sunday, October 8. The team will travel to the destination on the first two days, work at the location for the next five, and return home on the final two days. The coordinators have been and will continue to work with our partners in Kentucky and Tennessee to determine a location in need of our assistance and best suits our skills. More information will be coming in later July.

#### Dickinson TX Church Fire Donation

Following Hurricane Harvey in 2017 on SPDR's first trip to Texas to assist, the team met Pastor Deb Grant at Faith Lutheran in Dickinson, TX, just outside of Galveston, TX. Her church had major damage caused by Harvey's four feet of water flooding the offices and Sanctuary. This first team and several other SPDR Teams got to know and love Pastor Grant as she was very involved in our recovery work in both Galveston and Houston. Pastor Grant retired five years ago and still lives in the east Houston area.

Unfortunately, Faith Lutheran caught fire this past June 2 from unknown causes and many rooms and offices were destroyed. The Sanctuary was spared the fire and only received smoke damage. The congregation plans to rebuild. A link to a news story with video about the fire is shown here:


