November marks one of my favorite non-church holidays - Thanksgiving. The very nature of the day has deep meaning to us as believers. And I am not speaking of the mixed bag of American history, with the highs and lows that we remember in honesty as people living in this country. I am speaking of the nature of giving thanks for all that we have.

A pastor planted a simple but important phrase in my mind years ago. "Live with an attitude of gratitude."

The church needs your unique presence and gifts, given joyfully to the glory of God. Whether you travel with the disaster relief team, help feed our community, tie quilts, or tend tomatoes in our community garden; your gifts are needed.

In addition to Thanksgiving month, November is our dedicated stewardship focus month in the church. I encourage each of us to examine how we can continue to grow in our cheerful giving. Can we increase our regular financial giving just a bit each month? Can I give more time and skill to a ministry? Can I train someone else in a ministry that I know I won't be able to lead forever?

God has given us so much to joyfully use to God's glory right here. Thank you deeply for all you give in such a variety of ways. Thank you for your investment in God's ministry of caring for neighbors and proclaiming the gospel here in Fridley and the north metro area.

Let us continue to live lives consecrated to the Lord's work, joyfully taking an attitude of gratitude in our lives as disciples of Christ, gratefully using and giving what the Lord has first given us.

Fall Trip and Outreach Facility Dedication St. Philip's Disaster Relief



A SPDR team of 12 individuals travel to the Mayfield, KY area to help rebuild homes following devastating tornadoes which occurred in 2021. It was a nine day trip from Saturday, September 30 through Sunday, October 8, including four travel days.

The team traveled 1750 miles - from St. Philip's to Fulton and back and to and from the jobsites in Mayfield each day. We worked a total of 480 hours rebuilding three homes and cooking for the team. The average age of the team members was 74 and the average number of trips for the twelve team members was 25. Kentucky weather the week the team was there... two very hot days, one rainy day and two cool and comfortable days, a bit of everything. Thank you to all the team members on this trip and to all of those who support our journeys.

SPDR coordinators participated in the new Outreach Storage Facility dedication and open house on Sunday, October 15. Pastor Matt dedicated the building and gave the blessing. Following the dedication an open house was held so those in attendance could view the new facility. It was attended by about 75 individuals.

Building For The Future II - Outreach Storage Facility

A dream that began in 2014 at a Property and Grounds Committee Meeting, is now a reality.

The new St. Philip's Outreach Storage Facility was dedicated on Sunday, October 15. The dedication was followed by a facility open house so those in attendance could tour the new building. About 75 individuals were present at the dedication. This was the first of five projects to be completed by Building For The Future II funding.

Storage Facility, yes, but it is really St. Philip's Outreach Storage Facility. It was designed to house our main outreach ministries of which over 300 individuals participate yearly.

- 1. Property and Grounds equipment that is needed to maintain our seven-acre campus which in turn invites our community to worship and spread the word of God.
- 2. All the supplies needed to hold *St. Philip's Annual Garage Sale*, a ministry that provides the necessities of life to the community at a low price.
- 3. The *St. Philip's Disaster Relief* trailers, tools, equipment, supplies, and workspace needed to assist the survivors of natural disasters across the United States.
- 4. All the needed supplies for the *Chore Corps* to assist local residents with household tasks they cannot do themselves.
- 5. Equipment and workspace for the Wednesday Morning Men's Work Group.
- 6. Many of the *Garden Group's* tools and supplies are stored in the new building, a ministry that produces 600 800 pounds of produce each year for St. Philip's Food & Clothing Shelf Ministry.

Thank you to everyone who was involved with the design and construction of the new Outreach Facility and everyone who supported the project in so many ways.

Food & Clothing Shelf

During the past 6 years much has been accomplished by the Food & Clothing Shelf. Our motto is Until all are fed . . . and clothed and that we have done.

But did you know:

We do blood pressure screenings on Tuesdays and Fridays and nearly half of all the guests choose to have their blood pressure taken.

We started stocking Bibles on the shelves and all the Bibles, including a few printed in Spanish have flown off the shelves. We have talked to Pastor Matt and will get more to hand out. We are overjoyed that we are not only feeding and clothing our neighbors, but we are also spreading the WORD.

We have a rack of crisis information to help point guests to possibilities for housing, physical and mental health, and other Anoka County Food Shelves for those who need food more than once every 30 days.

We receive a delivery of approximately 1,000 pounds of food every Tuesday morning. Daryl & Carol Gabrielson, Wes Grandstrand, and Richard Young are there almost every week to put all the food away before the 10:00 am opening of the doors to the first guests of the week. Jeanne Moffat is there every Tuesday to repackage and sort items.

The Garden Group has provided an incredible variety of produce throughout the summer months. Spence and Gay Minear, Art Demeyere, and others also share their garden bounty. Karen Block brought in (40) 5-pear trays from the pear trees in her yard. All this produce has been greeted with much appreciation from our guests.

Judy Greer, Karen Block, and Sandy Kallroos spend countless hours cleaning, sorting, tagging, and stocking all the donated clothing that we offer for free. In early October, Karen and Judy added new donated shelving units to better display kid's clothes, quilts, blankets, towels, and other various folded items. They also purchased a round rug for kids to sit on while reading books as their parents shop for clothes. In mid-October, they switch out summer to winter wear. The large quantity of off-season clothing storage is now being stored in one half of Room 6.


