GROW & WORSHIP

Growing Something Good Eric Nelson, Pastor

With our tame winter, it seems many started planning for gardens and outdoor planters shortly after the Christmas season ended.

No matter if we are fully into spring or finally get one winter storm so the kids can pull the sleds out, we know that spring is coming. This winter, in the lack of snow, the dormancy of plants was even more evident. The brown grass, withered remains of perennials, and bare-branched trees all were more visible without the typical ice and snow. Plants wait to surge back to life. Seeds wait for soaking rains and bright sun to take root in new life.

In the Lenten season leading up to Easter, these things fit the seasonal pattern. All these things that seem to be dead come back to life. Yes, all of this is different from Christ who truly died and rose to life once again, but still the pattern speaks to us in meaningful ways.

Many choose to give up something as a discipline in Lent or take up a practice to encourage their life in faith. In this, an area is dug away. Time or intention is made with purpose. This leaves us in a prime place to grow something new or make space for something good to grow again that had been covered by weeds in previous seasons.

There can be a tendency to go back to our old ways when Easter comes when Lenten disciplines end. We begin to snack like usual, forget to drink our water, don't keep up with the devotional practice, etc. A great challenge in this season is to try to grow something good in this. As we carved out that metaphorical space in the ground, we listen for what life-giving thing God might be calling us to grow in this season.

Maybe we're called to reach out more, calling or texting one person each day. Maybe we're called to get involved in a new ministry at church. Maybe we're called to give time or resources to a ministry that means a lot to us.

God brings life-giving gifts in so many ways. Our wonderful task is to tend to these things, laying down our distractions (and pulling them up like weeds) so we can make space for these good gifts. We might wonder where to start sometimes. We may need to ask for others' advice. There will be days when we forget to tend closely, days when the sun doesn't shine, or rainfall isn't quite right. But we can remember that we have been raised to new life with purpose. We are raised to new life to produce good fruits so that others can experience the goodness of God.

As you look out at the plants beginning to grow again this spring, consider where God calls you to be raised to life-giving work as well. God renews us in each season, in this life and the next.

Upgrades to Sound in the Sanctuary!


We are talking about moving the soundboard in the Sanctuary, to the main level on the left side, towards the band in front of the pillar, just in front of the balcony. The removal of some pew chairs will be needed. Doing this will improve the sound quality because the soundboard technician will be able to hear what everyone else hears and communicate with the pastors and the band more efficiently. A box will be made to enclose the equipment and technician to enhance overall appearance.

In June, the organ is being restored, so in May we will be moving all the pew chairs from the balcony area for the pipes to be cleaned. The plan is to move the soundboard in May if all goes well.

The Legacy of Art at St. Philip's Heritage Group

This month we continue with *The Legacy of Art at St. Philip's* series and will focus on Norm Johns' design skills and his creation of a symbol that is used throughout St. Philip's. The Sanctuary of St. Philip's is filled with many symbols of our Christian faith. We see them on the altar, baptismal font, pulpit, and on the Baldachin.

The early church symbol could be seen on the outside of the building near the front door.



FIRST SYMBOL OF ST. PHILIP'S CHURCH



During the planning and construction of the new worship center, a new symbol was created. It is used as part of the church logo on letterhead and newsletters, on the website, in the wooden offering plates, on the dove in the chapel, and the outside wall of the building – near the main entrance.

An original drawing of the Norm Johns design is dated 1965. We can assume that this new design coordinated with the new Sanctuary. He may have drawn inspiration from the plans for the Baldachin. The Baldachin shape is also a modified Celtic cross and there are loaves and fish images.

From the 25th Anniversary booklet, we learn about the planning and construction of the new facility.

During this time, a new symbol for St. Philip's, designed by member Norman Johns, was approved.

The symbol, a modified Greek cross with two kernels of barley and two fish, reminds us of Philip's involvement in the feeding of the 5,000, as well as the continuing challenge before St. Philip's congregation to invite the multitudes to come and be fed by the Bread of Life.
