

Preparation is ongoing for the 2024 Fall SPDR trip which will take place from September 21–29 in Clarksville, TN, where the team will assist in the rebuild effort. Clarksville was struck by a tornado in December, 2023, resulting in three deaths and destroying 243 homes. Registration has been completed. 
