20 So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

2 Corinthians 5:20

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ Jesus,

Grace, love, and peace be to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Outreach is an important part of what we do as the Christian church. It does, however, mean different things to different Christians. For many folks, outreach means service ministries to the community. For others, it means evangelism ministries. I've served at a congregation where the outreach committee was responsible for both community service and evangelism. That congregation felt that the two worked hand in hand. I like that idea. We need to tell people about the saving grace of Christ Jesus and one of the ways to do that is through service. As we continue to serve God by serving others, people will inquire as to why we are doing it. Our answers should be to tell and lead people to Jesus.

In the new year we need to continue our service ministries to the community and get more members involved. As more people come to be part of St. Philip's, we need to connect with them and help them become a part of the congregation. How do we do this? If you don't know someone at church, introduce yourself. When you meet new people, invite them to the groups and activities you take part in. As you get to know new people, connect them with folks who share their interests and gifts. It is a natural flow of outreach, connection, and then to membership. There is no magic formula to get people connected. What is important is to get to know people and make them feel welcome and part of the community. St. Philip's has so many wonderful opportunities to share; we can serve others by helping them get connected.





Updates & Trip Info St. Philip's Disaster Relief



The SPDR Ministry would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone that contributed financially to SPDR in 2024. Your generosity enables our teams to physically help survivors of natural disasters. Your contributions also enable us to send financial assistance to areas in need following a natural disaster event. Thank you for your continued support.

The people living in the Los Angeles, CA area are undergoing experiencing challenging times. Wildfires are threatening homes and lives. The SPDR Ministry is doing what they can to help. In mid-January, our ministry made financial donations to the LA Westside Food Bank, the Salvation Army Pasadena, the Orphan Grain Train, the Convoy of Hope, and Lutheran Disaster Response for a total of \$3000. Thrivent will match this money on a 1-to-2 ratio for an additional \$1500 bringing total to \$4,500 for aid to the fire survivors.

2025 Spring Trip - SPDR will be sending a team, for the second time, to Clarksville, TN from April 26 - May 2, 2025, to assist in the rebuild following the December 11, 2023, tornado. The SPDR coordinators are currently working with the United Methodist Church Disaster partners to prepare for our week in Clarksville. Watch for more trip and registration information in late March.
