
Something New With Heritage! Heritage Group

Updates & Trip Info St. Philip's Disaster Relief



The SPDR Ministry, through various groups and agencies, donated \$3,000 to those impacted by the Los Angeles area fires in January. A \$1 for \$2 match from Thrivent added \$1,500, making the total donation \$4,500.

The SPDR spring trip will take place from Saturday, April 26, to Sunday, May 4. The team will return to Clarksville, TN, to help the survivors of the devastating tornadoes that occurred in December 2023. Planning and coordination are underway with our Tennessee partners.

The team will be staying at the Madison Street United Methodist Church, where we stayed on our previous trip to Clarksville. Tentative plans are to do rebuild work through Tennessee/Western Kentucky UMC Disaster Recovery and possibly build new homes through the Appalachia Service Project.

Registration and additional trip information will be available in late March. All are welcome on the trip. No building skills are required.


