Prayer Matters Sherri Otto, Associate Pastor

Last month, the staff and two Board members attended the Tool Kit, put on by the Minneapolis Area Synod. This was a morning of learning, networking, and connecting with lay leaders and clergy in our Synod. During this time, we had the opportunity to hear from Bishop Jen and her staff and also attend two workshops of our choosing.

Bishop Jen emphasized the importance of having a diverse set of tools in our own tool kit to navigate the challenges of ministry, reminding us that we are not alone in this work. She highlighted the interconnectedness of churches within the Synod, emphasizing that when one church faces difficulties or is in transition, the others are there to offer support and prayers. The bishop's message stressed the significance of prayer as an essential practice that unites and strengthens the entire community.

So, I started to think about my own prayer life and would like to share a personal story that recently happened to me. I had been on leave from call, and after a few months, was feeling a bit down about it all. Despite my husband's assurances, not working made me feel like I wasn't contributing to our household and I felt I needed a job. I was sitting in our sunroom and I had an extensive conversation with God, going something like this: "God, what do you want me to do? Should I continue in the ministry or just go and get a job at PetSmart or Home Depot? I'm feeling a bit lost. God, can you please give me a sign?"

After sitting for a bit, I pulled myself together and began working around the house. When the phone rang two hours later, it was Pastor Matt. He invited me to lunch to discuss the possibility of me serving as St. Philip's Interim Associate Pastor! I got off the phone and said, "Thank you God!"

I understand that prayer doesn't always work instantaneously; there are people who pray daily for health, healing, strength, and other blessings, and sometimes the answers to those prayers take longer than we would like. I believe that God hears each one of us and sends us people in our lives to help with the things that we cannot do alone. I also believe that the Holy Spirit is active in our lives, moving in ways we cannot even fathom. Prayer is an action that we can do when we are left without knowing what to do. It helps us connect with God to find comfort and peace.

So today and in the days to come, I pray for blessings upon you, dear people of St. Philip's. And I thank you for welcoming me with such warmth and sincerity! For inviting me in and making me feel like a member of this community from the very first day.

As Bishop Jen so beautifully reminded us, we are all connected in this journey of faith, and I am grateful to be walking alongside each and every one of you. I look forward to our future conversations and please know that my door is always open. I would love to hear from you!


I pray that your Lenten season has been and continues to be filled with renewal as you grow in your faith, and return to the Lord.

The team will be staying at the Madison Street United Methodist Church, where we stayed on our previous trip to Clarksville. Tentative plans are to do rebuild work through Tennessee/Western Kentucky UMC Disaster Recovery and possibly build new homes through the Appalachia Service Project.
