Interviews Heritage Group

In early 2015 Paul Daniels, from the ELCA Congregational Archives and History, contacted St. Philip's regarding gathering and preserving archival and historical information about our church.

By April of 2015, six St. Philip's members, including Arlene Hamernik, Grace Kurtz, Dick Lekang, Thelma Nash, Ron Seekamp, Marlin Sorum, along with Pastor Joel Wight Hoogheem, and Office Manager, Jeannine Arcand began work on putting a group together.

One of the first projects undertaken by the newly formed group was to interview members and leaders of the early church to preserve their recollections of that time. Committee members were tasked with suggesting names of "pioneers" and "oldsters" in the congregation who would be candidates for interviews about St. Philip's and its history and growth.

Committee members contacted Linda Bjerke of Normandale Lutheran Church, Dean Johnson of Messiah Lutheran Church in Mountain Iron, MN, and Paul Daniels, ELCA archivist, for suggestions on selecting candidates, questions, and type of media used to record the conversations. Dean Johnson was most helpful in advising on how to approach this project.

By April 2016, the list of candidates and been narrowed to 12, questions and topics were finalized, and invitation letters were sent. The list of questions was included with the letter. Ten interviews were completed: Richard & Bette Blair, Pastor Norm & Clarice Eitrheim, Don & Anne Gilbertson, Earl Hatten, Dr. Kay Ingebrigtsen, Vern Johnson, Norlan Lee, Myron & Thelma Nash, Ron & Mary Seekamp, and Pastor Les Svendsen. Richard Lekang, Marlin Sorum, and Ron Seekamp conducted interviews. Cody Retzer, a student at Concordia College in St. Paul, helped with the recordings. Ralph Petersen provided the final editing. Arlene Hamernik was instrumental in coordinating and organizing everyone.

By January 2017, the interviews were completed and editing of video and audio was ongoing. In addition to video and audio from Cody, Ralph suggested, when possible, including items of visual interest relating to the interview. From the November 2017 meeting minutes, it appears that all interviews were completed, and Ralph Petersen created DVDs. The committee was more than pleased with the results.

DVDs of these oral history interviews are available in the Heritage Room. Anyone interested in viewing any of these DVDs is encouraged to contact a group member.

Spring Trip St. Philip's Disaster Relief



A 24-member SPDR team is in Clarksville, TN assisting survivors of floods and tornados that have occurred over the past 16 months. Their trip began on Saturday, April 26 and they will return on Sunday, May 4. The team is staying at the Madison Street United Methodist Church and is working under the guidance of the Tennessee/Western Kentucky UMC Disaster Recovery. Also, plans are underway for the 20th Anniversary of the SPDR Ministry... 2006-2026. As part of the event celebration, a 20-year time line is being created, one year at a time, on the outside wall of the Sanctuary in the office hallway. On the timeline will be all the trips taken and all special events of the ministry. Currently a brief early history and the first two years (2006 and 2007) are displayed. More yearly panels will be added in the months ahead. You are invited to stop by periodically to view important and intriguing history of the St. Philip's Disaster Relief Ministry.


