

Trip & 20th Anniversary St. Philip's Disaster Relief



A SPDR team comprised of 23 individuals returned to Clarksville, TN from April 26 - May 4. The team helped rebuild homes damaged by floods and tornados which occurred over the past two years. In one home damaged by a tornado, the team laid sub base flooring in the living room and then laid laminate flooring in the kitchen and living room. All the rooms were painted, the front porch and back deck were rebuilt, and the garage was resided. In another home that was flood damaged, three rooms and the garage were sheet rocked. The team worked under the guidance of the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) and stayed at the Madison Street United Methodist Church in downtown Clarksville. Current plans are to return to Clarksville for a fourth time this coming fall.

Plans are also underway for the 20th Anniversary of the SPDR Ministry (2006-2026). A 20-year timeline is being designed and constructed, two years at a time in the church office hallway. Stop by and see what the SPDR ministry has accomplished in the past 20 years. The Journey Continues.
