

# Trip & 20th Anniversary St. Philip's Disaster Relief



Plans are underway to send a SPDR team this fall to the Clarksville, TN area to assist in the rebuild of damage caused by floods and tornadoes over the past two years. This will be the seventh SPDR trip to this general Nashville area since COVID. We traveled three times to Waverly, TN, twice to Mayfield, KY, and twice to Clarksville, TN. We are currently attempting to establish firm trip dates, which will be in the mid-September to mid-October week range. More to follow.

Plans are also underway for the 20th Anniversary of the SPDR Ministry: 2006-2026. A 20-year timeline is being designed and constructed, two years at a time, in the church office hallway. The timeline is about 20% complete. Stop by and see what the SPDR ministry has accomplished in the past 20 years.

# News From Bille, Nigeria

Jotham Sumwashe, our contact in The Lutheran Church of Christ in Bille (LCCN Bille), sent news of our joint ministries and what's happening in Nigeria, with pictures. Mr. Sumwashe mentions fighting among various terrorist factions and persecution of Christians in major Christian states like, Plateau, Benue, Taraba and Adamawa. (See map on bulletin board.)

The church. Nevertheless, LCCN Bille celebrated Easter "well" with the many groups in the congregation enjoying special activities they traditionally do on that occasion.

LCCN Bille is removing its roofing and replacing it with iron rafters and aluminum sheets. The work has reached an advanced state. They had a mini launching and realized three million naira. [Almost \$2,000 US]

Our joint ministries. Evangelist, Amos Antibas, at our joint outreach project was sick in bed for the whole month of May. His relations took him home for treatment. He has since recovered and is now back at his working place. We gave him assistance for treatment and also provided him with some bags of cement to floor their new church.

Fourteen students got scholarships to secondary school from our joint account. A classroom which was blown up by a rain storm has been repaired. All the money is from the funds sent to our outreach project account.

We appreciate you very much for the funds. May the Almighty God continue to bless you.
