It's an exciting time for our congregation.

Now you may be wondering, "what can I do to help this process along?" First off, we all need to pray for the call process, our congregation, the call committee, and the possible candidates. You can give your insights and ideas to the call committee. If you know of a good pastor that is looking for a call, you can forward their name to the call committee. We also need to make sure we have a sufficient budget. We will be asking for a modest increase in the budget for 2026. Finally, pray some more. Prayer is the power of the church. God will strengthen us, enlighten us, and guide us through this new season here at St. Philip's.

A gentleman came in and purchased 35 boxes of clothing on Saturday, our half-price day. He donates these items to Listening House of St Paul, an organization serving the homeless. He does this in memory of his wife, who passed away. This, in itself is great, but then a few of our volunteers loaded up their cars and delivered these purchases to his house.

A group from Central Lutheran Church purchased 10 boxes of clothing to help their organization, Restoration Services, which also works with people in need.

Another woman purchased 40 pairs of jeans for her work with the homeless.

So, we reach an amazing number of people with this sale. 'What a ministry we have through it! I am so proud of St Philip's and the people who support it and the sale.

Thanks to Pastor Matt for his strong and vocal support of this sale, and to the staff for all the help they provide. In joyful exhaustion, I say thank you to all who helped with this sale and remember next year's sale is August 12 - 15! Praise be to God!
