Meals on Wheels







Christmastime

Food & Clothing Shelf

On average, St. Philip's Food Shelf has been purchasing a little more than \$1,000.00 of food per week from 2nd Harvest Heartland. Our goal is to maintain a healthy and helpful array of food for our visitors. We save \$40.00 per week by picking up approximately 1,200 pounds of food weekly. A faithful group of volunteers come each Tuesday to help fill shelves to ensure we are well stocked for the week. Our numbers keep increasing, and with SNAP benefits on a teeter totter, we expect numbers to continue to climb. If you are looking for a worthy place to give a year end tax deferred contribution, on top of your much needed St. Philip's general budget contributions, we would greatly appreciate a donation to help us strengthen our finances. Boys – Sizes 7/8, 10


Girls – Sizes 7/8, 10, and 14/16




