Landscape Updates

We continue to do our best to make our grounds look nice. We hired some younger folk to update the landscaping on our campus. The island cobblestones have been removed and replaced with a concrete walkway and apron to make easy access to the building.

A Japanese Lilac was planted in memory of Mike Anderson.

Along the front of the building (Sanctuary entrance) some dead bushes have been removed. Also, at the entrances to the big parking lot along W. Moore Lake Dr., we had the old rocks removed, weed barrier laid, and new rocks and boulders added.

Other areas of improvement include the Gaga ball pit being relocated to the back of the building between the garage and kitchen. Also, two trees have been removed by the bus stop bench, and the ditch along Highway 65 will be mowed by the city. In the spring the island plants that have been overgrown and root bound can be separated and moved to the front of the building to replace some of the less desirable bushes that have been removed.
